

**REGULAR SESSION
NOVEMBER 9, 2010**

The Trempealeau County Board of Supervisors met in Regular Session at the Government Center in the City of Whitehall, County of Trempealeau and State of Wisconsin on Tuesday, November 9, 2010 at 10:01 a.m. with Chair Wally Geske presiding. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was recited led by Chair Geske.

It was moved by Hensel Vold and seconded by Douglas Winters to accept the Call as read; this was unanimously carried by acclamation.

Roll was called. A quorum was met with all 17 supervisors in attendance.

Chair Geske announced the open meeting law requirements have been complied with by postings and notifications to the members and media.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA: It was moved by Arild Engeliem and seconded by Ernest Vold to adopt the 12 item amended agenda. Motion carried unanimously by vote of acclamation to approve the amended agenda.

MINUTES APPROVED: It was moved by Robert Duellman and seconded by John Aasen to adopt the October 7th and 18th minutes. Motion carried unanimously by a vote of acclamation to adopt the minutes.

APPEARANCES: SHERIFF DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Sheriff Richard Anderson reported the monthly figures for October. There were 95 bookings which broke down as 74 male and 21 female with 78 being White, 3 Black, 13 Hispanic, and 1 Asian. There were 4 INS holds. The average daily in county population was 31.16 and the out of county average was 6.35. There were 5.32 people on electronic monitoring for a total of 42.83 compared to 53.97 last year at this time. There were numbers to report for October traffic yet. He did say that the ERT was called out to put a homeowner safely back into their residence. There were rumors of damages to the home but the homeowner was just in the Sheriff's Department yesterday to thank them for their help and to report no damages.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT UPDATE: Jim Johnson, Highway Commissioner gave an update on this past season's costs. They did over 4,000 ton of paving and 47 miles of seal coating.

They bought 187,000 gallons of oil for a cost of \$345,000. 6,000 ton of material came from the hot mix plant that was used in all 15 townships in the county, 10 on Jackson County and 5 in Buffalo County. The Highway Department has done extensive culvert work from heavy rains in the county and they continue to work on flood damaged roads. They have done 50 miles of centerline painting in the county and 87 miles in Jackson County and 5 in Eau Claire County. The salt price went down 5% this year. This year they purchased a new truck, a used road widener, a good used chip spreader and a pick up. The Highway 95 and County Road J project in Arcadia is complete and the lights are up. Also the Highway 53 and Highway 10 project in Osseo is complete.

HIGHWAY BRIDGE PETITIONS: Clerk Syverson read the bridge petition requests for the Town of Arcadia (2), Chimney Rock (4), Ettrick (1), and Trempealeau (2) for a total of \$43,788.49.

AMERICAN LEGION POST & AUXILIARY DONATION TO HEALTH DEPARTMENT LEAD TESTING: County Commander Paul Beseler presented Cheryl Rhoda from the Health Department with a lead testing machine to measure the level of lead in the blood of children. This machine was on the Health Department’s wish list. The post and the auxiliary unanimously supported this purchase.

TCCTV STUDIO RECOGNITION: Matt Galewski, TCCTV Director on behalf of the Extension/Education & Communications Committee presented Wade Britzius with the first annual Trailblazer Award. This award is to recognize people who support the betterment of TCCTV. Matt said Wade was the face of TCCTV and still is as he still helps with some programming. Wade talked about introducing the idea of live County Board meetings and just getting the station started. Now there are two stations and public has grown to expect to see their local elected officials on TV in their meetings. Wade also talked about how technology and TV has changed and improved over the years.

SUPERVISOR DAVID SUCHLA – BUDGET ANALYSIS PRESENTATION: David Suchla presented the board with a power point on several budgets he had analyzed over several years to show a trend in year end spending. He did not mention office names on purpose. The graphs showed some offices with small fluctuations throughout the years and other with large swings of spending during certain months. Suchla created the power point to show his concerns about expenditure increases at year end of 25% or more for some departments.

RESOLUTION**

Expenditure Restriction for 2010 Budget

WHEREAS a number of Departments have spent considerably less than 75 percent of their approved budgets for 2010 as of October 1, 2010, and

WHEREAS Departments should generally not need more than 25 percent of their budget allowance for the last quarter of the year to cover salaries or other operation expenses, and

WHEREAS the County should be making every effort to conserve financial resources by avoiding unnecessary expenditures

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that expenditures from all budgets during the last quarter of 2010 be limited to 25 percent of the total budget which had been approved for the year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that with the approval of the committee responsible for a department's budget, budget expenditures may exceed the 25 percent limit up to the budget total previously set by the County Board in the 2010 budget process. Approvals should generally be limited to meet obligations for salaries, existing contracts, State and Federal mandated programs or other circumstances deemed to be in the County's best interest.

It was moved by Michael Nelson and seconded by Rodney Severson to adopt the resolution. George Brandt called a point of order that the resolution was brought back from last month after it failed for lack of a 2/3 vote. LaVerne said the resolution had changed enough to qualify as a new resolution. Dick Miller made a point of order on how many times Suchla had spoken on this matter. Chair Geske said Suchla had not spoken on the matter yet. Suchla said these charts force the board to look at the numbers as he is not blaming the department heads. Robert Duellman pointed out that the boards from the past aren't here now, referring to Suchla's charts from the past years and that this is new board. Dick Miller said that most departments have planned expenditures throughout the year. From Suchla's graphs some years the departments spent 93% of their budget and other years 96% of it, returning the rest to the general fund. By instituting Suchla's plan departments will have no incentive to return any to the general fund. Maybe now that department will spend 25% each quarter to equal 100% instead of the 93% or 96% in the past. Miller also felt that the graphs should have shown revenues for those departments to see if the spending was justified by the income or grants received. Chair Geske put any more discussion on the subject on hold until after the reading of the 2011 budget which was set for 11:00 am on the budget.

At 11:03 a.m. Clerk Syverson read the first reading of the proposed 2011 budget. He read the budgeted request, anticipated revenues and the requested tax levy for each account number in each department. Total anticipated expenditures were \$51,914,252.63 and the anticipated revenues totaled \$41,782,306.98 leaving \$10,131,945.65 for requested levy. It was moved by Michael Nelson and seconded by Rodney Severson to approve the budget as read. It was moved by David Suchla and seconded by Olin Fimreite to keep the budget hearing open to the public. Motion carried unanimously by a vote of acclamation to keep the budget open to the public. Jeff McIntyre was questioned about the Benefit Specialist position. He said the increase is due to it being full time whereas past budgets it wasn't. Jim Johnson said they need to increase his budget \$2149.14 on a bridge aid issue. George Brandt noticed a big change in the TV Studio budget. He made a motion to amend the budget and take the \$60,657.87 decrease proposed in that budget and use the \$22800.86 in savings unallocated and transfer \$37,856.95 from the general fund to make up the difference. John

Aasen seconded it. George said resources have been strained over the years and the number and quality of programs have declined as a result. Dick Miller stated that he was against using the general fund to encumber an ongoing expense. Ernest Vold apologized for being absent for most of the budget process as he was in the hospital, however he said the intention of the Executive/Finance Committee was to reduce the administration position and put the remaining department with another department to oversee it. That department would be responsible for not only programming but fundraising and coordinating volunteers as well. Dick Miller said he is not comfortable with this as the direction of the department seems unsure. David Suchla said they spoke about the plans for that department in closed session and had a plan but they can't discuss it now without going into closed session. Dick said Executive/Finance Committee discussed this idea last year and to have the duties shift to UW Extension office but now Jon Zander is leaving and he isn't sure if \$60,000 would be a true savings as we would need some other department to help. Mark Smick said it was not anyone's goal to discontinue the TV Studio operation but to balance the budget and hold the limit. Arild Engeliien asked how important the TV Studio is to everyone and do we need the station to exist in the county. It is one method of getting the message out and if we think it is a value we should support it. Roll call vote taken on the amendment, with 9 no votes and 6 yes and 2 abstain. The no votes were Dick Miller, Wally Geske, Olin Fimreite, Dave Suchla, Rodney Severson, Hensel Vold, Michael Nelson, Douglas Winters, and Mark Smick. The two abstained were Tom Bice and Robert Duellman. Corporation Council instructed Clerk to ask those that abstained if they wanted to vote. Both Bice and Duellman voted no. The amendment failed with 11 no votes and 6 yes.

The supervisors recessed for lunch at 12:15 p.m. At 1:32 p.m. roll was called. A quorum was met with all 17 supervisors in attendance.

The budget hearing continued. David Suchla made a motion that \$22,800.86 go to the TV Studio budget as a contingency to Executive/Finance Committee. Olin Fimreite seconded it. Motion carried unanimously. Dick Miller questioned the Register of Deeds Deputy that scanned documents and now is not scheduled to be filled. Wally Geske said they instructed Rose to apply for grant money to possibly refill that position. Dick also reminded the supervisors that contracts have not been settled yet for 2011. Dick spoke on behalf of the Property Committee that they have spent \$7,000 for an air conditioner unit which seems to be a short term fix about every two years. They would like to replace it with a \$30,000 air conditioner industrial grade unit. Hensel Vold said that with static electricity someone could potentially short out the system. Property Committee did look at a possible phone savings to go towards the new AC unit. Tom Bice evaluated the system thoroughly and he will gladly offer his advice. He said industrial grade isn't always better. He feels if it is done properly, the problem can be remedied without spending that much money. George Brandt thanked the departments for bringing in their budgets and making the bottom line as requested and to Executive/Finance Committee for doing a good job on the budget. Mark Smick commended the department heads for being responsible with their budgets and holding the line. He said departments were asked to bring in comparables with other counties and they brought those along with state mandates and state statutes. Mark said we can't afford these state mandates unless the state helps fund them. Olin Fimreite was glad we didn't raise taxes. Chair Geske asked for anymore public comment. Hearing none, the public hearing closed at 2:03 p.m. Clerk Syverson said the mill rate would be .00584387396 and there would be \$28,998.48 for tax exempt computers. Roll call vote taken to approve the 2011 budget; motion carried with 16 yes votes and 1 no vote, 2011 budget adopted. The no vote was Hensel Vold.

The supervisors then returned to discussion on the 2010-11-01 resolution. David Suchla continued with his power point. Much discussion held. George Brandt asked if coming in under budget at 93%

or 96% was a bad thing. Suchla said he sees it coming in at 88% with this resolution in place which could mean \$1.2 million. Tom Bice reminded everyone that the governor has already stated that there is no end to the economic slowdown in sight. Roll call vote taken; motion failed for lack of a 2/3 vote with 10 yes votes and 7 no votes. The no votes were Ernest Vold, Arild Engelién, George Brandt, Rob Reichwein, Michelle Haines, Dick Miller and Hensel Vold.

At 2:15 pm Chair Geske left the meeting and Vice Chair Ernest Vold assumed the duties.

It was moved by John Aasen and seconded by Rodney Severson to adopt the resolution. LaVerne said he had some legality concerns regarding running on county roads for sections of the trail and this being a private club and state statutes speak about public trails so he sent a letter to the Attorney General's Office about a month ago and we should get a reply by March which shouldn't be a problem because the trails won't open until April at the soonest. David Suchla said there has been a change and the club has now offered to open up the trails to anyone with proof of insurance. Mark Bartow spoke on behalf of the CAP Club who asked the County to allow certain sections of road to be ridden on to be able to connect with other trails. He said the club has about 40 families in it with over 50 sponsors. He said the trails are already signed like public trails. Currently if a non member

wants to ride the trails they have to be with a member. They hold their meeting every third Thursday of the month at various sponsor sites. They are requesting a small section on County Road E from Witt Hill Road to Elk Creek and another spot by the corner of County Road O and E. Arild Engeliien clarified that there would be no charge to ride the trail, just proof of insurance. Mark said they never been kicked off of anyone's property. They use no state funding and they have their own mowers and a trailer and are self sufficient. Douglas Winters asked if we approve this now and the Attorney General finds issues with it later. LaVerne said we could rescind it if necessary. Roll call vote taken; resolution adopted with 14 yes votes and 2 no votes. The no votes were Douglas Winters and Dick Miller.
