APPEARANCES: SHERIFF DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Sheriff Richard Anderson reported the monthly figures for May. There were 112 bookings with 94 being male and 18 female. They consisted of 88 White, 1 Black, 17 Hispanic, 1 Asian and 5 Native Americans. The average daily in county population was 32.90 and the out of county average was 4.16. There were 3.39 people on electronic monitoring for a total of 40.45 compared to 40.02 last year at this time. There were 9.58 on Huber and 5 INS Holds. There were 50 car/deer crashes, 7 crashes with personal injury and 9 with property damage. There was one fatality.

RESTORE FUNDING FOR WISCONSIN CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES

WHEREAS Trempealeau County, along with the other 71 counties in the State of Wisconsin, provides child support services to its residents including paternity establishment, obtaining child support orders, enforcing and modifying orders, and locating non-custodial parents; and,

WHEREAS Wisconsin is a top state in the collection and enforcement of child support orders; and

WHEREAS the Governor's proposed 2011-2013 biennium budget represents a disinvestment by the State in child support enforcement, cutting General Purpose (GPR) funding by one half to county child support programs for State Fiscal Year 2012-2013; and,

WHEREAS a reduction in such funding will have adverse effects not only to the agency and staff in Trempealeau County, but more importantly, to the children and families of Trempealeau County and the State of Wisconsin; and,

WHEREAS a decrease in funding will decrease the level of service and child support currently provided to the families of Trempealeau County and will place a higher burden on the taxpayers of this county.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Trempealeau County Board of Supervisors does hereby request the legislature to restore funding for child support enforcement programs in the 2011-2013 biennium to current levels by adding \$4.25 million in GPR for the 2012-2013 State Fiscal Year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk is directed to provide a copy of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, each legislator in the Wisconsin Senate and Assembly who represents constituents from Trempealeau County and Secretary Eloise Anderson, Department of Children And Families.

**IMPLEMENTING COUNTY PICK-UP OF EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT
CONTRIBUTIONS PURSUANT TO 26 U.S. CODE SECTION 414(h)(2)**

WHEREAS Internal Revenue Code (“Code”) section 414(h)(2) permits public employers to “pick up” contributions to a government pension plan that are designated as employee contributions so that they may be paid for on a pre-tax basis and thereby be excluded from an employee’s taxable income, provided the contributions are paid by the employer in lieu of contributions by the employee, and the employee may not elect, directly or indirectly, to receive the amounts instead of having them paid by the employer; and

WHEREAS the County Board of Trempealeau County has determined that taking this action does not increase the County’s cost of funding the retirement benefits owed to the Wisconsin Retirement System and chooses to take this action in order to allow covered employees to exclude such amounts from their taxable income due to the application of Code section 414(h)(2);

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Pursuant to Code section 414(h)(2), the Trempealeau County Board hereby elects to pick-up all contributions designated as employee contributions that its covered employees owe to the Wisconsin Retirement System (“WRS”).
2. Pursuant to this resolution, all contributions that are designated as employee contributions to WRS will be paid by the County in accordance with the rules of Code section 414(h)(2). These pick-up contributions will be withheld from the employee wages as a condition of employment with no individual discretion by employees to have some other amount withheld or to have no amount withheld.
3. The effective date of this Resolution is the first full pay period after July 1, 2011 and contributions to WRS made prior to this date will not be subject to these provisions.

WHEREAS the realignment of CTH J has resulted in that portion of the new CTH J, as shown on the diagram (as depicted in gray scaling) which is attached hereto, marked “Exhibit A”, and incorporated herein by this reference, and as more specifically described in the legal description set forth in Exhibit B, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, which shall serve as a public street as the new CTH J, and the City has agreed to transfer jurisdiction of the new CTH J to the County; and

WHEREAS the jurisdictional transfer described above would ensure that the County would have all jurisdictional responsibility for the new CTH J, including but not limited to all maintenance, upkeep, repairs, and future construction of the public street that will be the new CTH J; and

WHEREAS the County and the City approve of the jurisdictional transfer of said portion of the new CTH J; now

THEREFORE in accordance with the *Wis. Stat 83 025(1) (c)* and *Wis. Stat 66 0301(2)* be it resolved by the City of Arcadia that the jurisdiction of the new CTH J as described above be transferred to the County of Trempealeau and the Trempealeau County Highway Department.

WHEREAS responsibility for the old location of CTH J , including but not limited to all maintenance, upkeep and future construction of the parking lot and park to provide a safe and convenient parking and gathering area for the public; and

WHEREAS the County and the City approve of the jurisdictional transfer of said portion of the old CTH J; now

THEREFORE in accordance with the *Wis. Stat. §83.025(1) (c)* and *Wis. Stat. §66.0301(2)* be it resolved by the Trempealeau County Highway Department, the Trempealeau County Board of Supervisors, and the City of Arcadia that the jurisdiction of the old CTH J as described above be transferred to the City of Arcadia.
