WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Wisconsin enacted legislation providing for allocation to respective counties on an acreage basis for the county fish and game projects on the condition that there is a local match for the state allocation, and

WHEREAS, Trempealeau County desires to participate in county fish and game projects pursuant to provisions of section 23.09 (12) of the Wisconsin Statutes, and

WHEREAS, the funds to be made available by the State for this project year are not likely to exceed \$7,000 and a local private source has made commitment to provide the required local match for the State funds

WHEREAS this move would allow streamlining complementary duties currently performed individually by the departments, improving work flow efficiencies and time management of staff, and

WHEREAS this move would not create significant financial savings, but rather create better efficiency and customer service to the public.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Land Records Department be dissolved, effective January 1, 2016, and the Land Records staff shall, thereafter, report to the Department of Land Management.

RESOLUTION 2015-09-05 ORDINANCE-REVISE FINANCING OF 9-1-1 EMERGENCY  
TELEPHONE SYSTEM:

WHEREAS, on July 19, 1993, the County Board of Supervisors adopted a Financing of 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the 1993 ordinance authorized the local telephone company to collect fees, as limited by statute, from all service users in the County to finance the costs related to the establishment of an enhanced 9-1-1 system, and

WHEREAS, since that time the law relating to funding of countywide emergency telephone systems in the Wisconsin Statutes was moved from chapter 146 to chapter 256, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to revise the County's emergency telephone system funding ordinance to update the statutory references and to make other minor revisions.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Trempealeau County Board of Supervisors adopts the attached revised Emergency Telephone System Funding Ordinance.

**ORDINANCE**

The County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Emergency 9-1-1 System. There is hereby established a sophisticated emergency telephone system to be operated and maintained by the Trempealeau County Sheriff's Department at its Law Enforcement Center in the City of Whitehall which shall be in accordance with the plan submitted to the telephone utilities involved in its operation, all pursuant to the provisions of 256.35(3)(b) ~~446.70~~, Wis. Stats.

SECTION 2: Cost Assessment. All telephone service users in Trempealeau County which have access to an enhanced 9-1-1 telephone system shall be required to pay the costs of said system as authorized by State Law 256.35(3)(b) ~~446.70~~, Wis. Stats., and as determined by the telecommunications utilities serving such users in Trempealeau County.

SECTION 3: Cost Levy and Collection. All telecommunications utilities serving Trempealeau County shall bill the service users for all of the costs referred to in 256.35(3)(b) ~~446.70~~, on a maximum amount of time allowed by Statute, and as approved by the appropriate agency of the State of Wisconsin, all as part of the regular billing to those service users.

SECTION 4: Contract Execution. The Trempealeau County ~~9-1-1~~ Law Enforcement/Emergency Management Committee is hereby empowered to enter into all necessary contracts and covenants required by State law to arrange for the installation and operations of said enhanced 9-1-1 system.

SECTION 5: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 6: Any existing Ordinances, Codes, Resolutions or portions thereof in conflict with this Ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists.

SECTION 7: If any claims, provisions or portions of this ordinance are adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby. Clerk Syverson read the resolution. It was moved by Ernie Vold and seconded by Richard Frey to adopt the resolution. No discussion. Roll call vote taken; motion carried with 15 yes votes; resolution adopted.

RESOLUTION 2015-09-06 SUPPORT OF LRB 0773/2 & 1440/2 AND CAUSING OR  
THREATENING BODILY HARM TO CERTAIN CHILD WELFARE AND JUVENILE JUSTICE  
WORKER AND PROVIDING A PENALTY:

WHEREAS, under current law, a person who intentionally causes bodily harm to another without the other person's consent commits the crime of ordinary battery, the penalties for which increase depending on the severity of the injury the person causes his or her victim. A person convicted of ordinary battery is subject to fines and periods of imprisonment. Current law provides more severe penalties for battery committed under certain circumstances against certain government officials, employees and agents; and

WHEREAS, among those covered under these "special circumstances battery": provisions are law enforcement officers, fire fighters, and probation, parole, and aftercare agents. A person convicted of intentionally causing bodily harm to these employees is guilty of a Class H felony and may be fined not more than \$10,000 or sentenced to a term of imprisonment of not more than six years, or both; and

WHEREAS, proposed legislation extends the special circumstances battery provisions to a person who is employed by, or under contract with, a court, a county department of human or social services, a tribal child welfare agency, or the department of children and families to provide intake, dispositional, or other services relating to child welfare or juvenile justice workers.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the undersigning members of the Human Services Board recommend adoption of the following resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Trempealeau County Board of Supervisors does support proposed legislation extending the special circumstances battery provisions to a person who is employed by, or under contract with, a court, a county department of human or social services, a tribal child welfare agency, or the department of children and families, to provide intake, dispositional or other services relating to child welfare or juvenile justice workers; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Trempealeau County Clerk be directed to forward a copy of this resolution to all Wisconsin Counties and to the Legislature and Governor.

RESOLUTION 2015-09-07 DESIGNATION OF COMMITTED FUND BALANCE:

WHEREAS, Trempealeau County has a number of Non-Lapsing fund balance accounts of which the Workers' Compensation account is one, and

Whereas, the Workers' Compensation account is an accumulating fund that has been established to build to \$1.2 million and then maintained at that balance, and

WHEREAS, Trempealeau County's auditors suggested that a fund of this type should be designated as a "Committed" fund balance and shown on Financial Statements as such, and

WHEREAS, a Committed Fund is a fund balance that is constrained for a specific purpose imposed by the government through formal action of the highest level of decision making authority and passed by resolution of the County Board.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Workers' Compensation Fund Balance be designated as a Committed Fund and shown as such on Financial Statements.
