

**Trempealeau County Moratorium Committee  
Sound Subcommittee Meeting**

**Friday, May 16, 2013, 11:00-1:00 p.m.**

**Conference Room, Trempealeau County Health Department, Whitehall, WI**

1. Meeting was called to order at 11:30 a.m. by Paul Winey
2. Present: Subcommittee members Paul Winey and Elizabeth Feil. Subcommittee member Pamela Nelson was not present.
3. Certification of Open Meeting Law Requirements. Requirements were certified.
4. Motion to approve the agenda was made by Paul Winey, seconded by Elizabeth Feil. Motion carried unanimously.
5. Elizabeth Feil nominated Paul Winey to be president of the subcommittee, and Paul Winey seconded the nomination. Motion passed unanimously.
6. Paul Winey nominated Elizabeth Feil to be secretary of the subcommittee, and Elizabeth Feil seconded the nomination. Motion passed unanimously.
7. The subcommittee discussed the community survey, which has been mailed. The subcommittee will review the results of the survey when they are available.

The subcommittee reviewed three documents on sound-related issues which were submitted by Paul Winey: the State of Minnesota's toolkit on sand mining, Trempealeau County's Chapter 13 ordinance, and the State of Wisconsin's PSC 128.14. These documents show how state and local governments can and have acted to make sure that activities like sand mining do not produce excessive noise that can be heard by people and animals on properties in the vicinity. These documents give guidance on numerical values for sound intensity that exceeds acceptable levels.
9. The subcommittee discussed the anticipated content of its final report to the Moratorium Committee, including research, recommendations and report format.
10. The next subcommittee meeting was scheduled for Friday, June 13 at 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Trempealeau County Health Department conference room.
11. Adjournment. Elizabeth Feil made a motion to adjourn at 1:15 p.m. Motion seconded by Paul Winey. Motion carried unanimously, and meeting was adjourned at 1:15 p.m.
